Let's Go Outside and Learn Science

This week the children will be taking part in fun science lessons outside of the classroom.

Year 6 will design their own landing craft to safely carry 'egg passengers'. They will investigate various high points from where they can launch each craft. Year 6 will also take part in further hands-on experiments outside.

Year 5 will be looking at the various habitats around school and using their statistical skills to analyse their findings.

Year 4 will be studying 'States of Matter' and will be looking closely at volume and how solids change into liquids.
