

Year Reception — Autumn 2 — Traditional Tales/Celebrations

Development Matters: Understanding of the World (People & Communities, The World, Technology 40-60/ELG)

- Enjoys joining in with family customs and routines.
- Talk about past and present events in the lives of other family members.
- They know about similarities and differences between themselves, others, families, communities, traditions.
- Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change.
- Children know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things.
- They talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary.
- They make observations of animals and plants, explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.
- Completes a simple program on a computer
- Uses ICT hardware to interact with age-appropriate computer software.
- Children recognise that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools.
- They select and use technology for particular purposes.



Story of Diwali



Look at a map and globe of the world, finding our country and other places. Focus on India. Introduce the festival of Diwali, looking at the story of Rama and Sita. Explore

Hindu religion and how the festival is celebrated all over the world, how it represents light over darkness (hence why we call it the festival of light). Discuss how it is a time for exchanging gifts (linking to similarities with **Christmas**). Children begin the process of using salt dough to make their own divalamps; link with describing states of matter.





Discuss Bonfire Night: the history around it, the historical character Guy Fawkes and how it is a significant event in our country. Explore the event through the creation of work in different media, movement and dance.

The Little Red Hen



Explore concepts of fairness, equal contribution and good teamwork by using the story of the Little Red Hen. What would you have done in the same situation if you weren't being helped?

Introduce Remembrance Day; how we remember all those who fought in wars and died. What is war? Why do people fight? Do we sometimes



want to fight others, why is this? Make poppies with drawing, paints and collage to signify our remembrance and display in classroom.



Explore prior learning with **Diwali**, and the lamps we began to make. Discuss the state of the lamps now. How have they changed? Invite

the children to decorate their divas using a range of different media (paint, glitter, sequins, jewels etc.)

The Three Billy Goats Gruff



Using the story, discuss the troll's actions and how his actions affected the feelings of others. Was he right to try and hurt the goats?



Showing some cress seeds, ask the children what they think they need to grow. Placing different pots of cress in different

conditions (by window, in cupboard etc.) the children predict which will grow the most.





Introduce the French artist Claude Monet and his series of water lilies paintings. Model the technique of making a bridge with masking tape, finger painting around it, then removing the masking tape once dried.

Jack and the Beanstalk



Read the story together and talk about what Jack did. Why did he need to sell the cow? Was he right to take the giants things? What would you have done in that situation? Discuss alternatives to the story with the children.

Using a range of different media, children use junk model materials to build their own beanstalks and castles, or with blocks and small world figures. Children think about what a bean needs to grow, also looking at the results from last week's cress growing.





The Nativity Story/Christmas

Revisit learning from earlier in the Term by exploring the religion of **Christianity** and how this is a special time of year for Christians. Show the Nativity story; ask who remembers performing in Nursery. Discuss the main people, and how this happened long time ago.





Link the Nativity to the festival of **Christmas** that is celebrated at this time of the year, comparing to Diwali. Look again at the map of the world and show how different countries celebrate it in different ways. Use the iPads to research this further and create maps.

Christmas



Children recall their own past experiences with their own families at Christmas time and discuss with each other, sharing pictures of

their own trees from home. They write a letter and go on a **local walk** to the library for a special visit from Santa.





Children perform their Christmas Production for their families and peers, singing, dancing and acting together. They complete craft activities such as calendars and cards, give cards to their friends and take them home for the Christmas Holidays.
